On 19/4/2019 in the evening, I along with ASI Md. Ajahar and police team of Lilong PS was patrolling in and around the jurisdiction of Lilong PS. At about 7:00 pm when our patrolling team was on Idigah road near Lilong Nganglou some members of ANJUMAN a civil organisation coming on a car stopped our police team and provided information that one drug peddler namely Md. Mufizuddin (40) yrs. was seen coming on foot along the same road in the opposite direction to our patrolling team with the possession of illegal drugs. In the meantime, when I was trying to give information to my senior officer about the information, one person was coming toward our police team hurriedly holding black polythene plastic in a very suspicious manner. When he saw our police team he turned around and fled way. Our police team with the help of members of ANJUMAN managed to detain him. On verification he identified himself as Md. Mufizuddin (40) S/O (L) Md. Abdur Rahaman of Lilong Haoreibi Makha Liekai Lairabakhong. Checked the black polythene bag which he brought in presence of the independent witnesses and **found 3(three) green plastic caps containing brown powder suspected to be Heroin no. 4 wrapped in a thin transparent plastic bag and 26(twenty six) small packets light blue in colour suspected to contain WY tablets.** On questioning, he revealed that the same brown powder was heroin no. 4 and light blue small packets contained WY tablets.

On further questioning, he disclosed that he bought the same illegal drugs from one peddler namely Md. Tomba s/o Md. Salam of Lilong Dam Maning for sale to his customer drugs users for his wrongful gain. He also revealed that one of his associate namely Md. Wahidur Rahaman from Lilong Atoukhong Mamang Leikai would also come along the same road with illegal drugs. Accordingly I alerted all my police team and took position. After about 5 minutes, one person was coming toward the area in a very suspicious manner holding a black polythene plastic and Md. **Mufizuddin identified the individual as Md. Wahidur Rahaman.** When Md. Wahidur Rahaman came nearby our Police team over power him. On verification he identified himself as **Md. Wahidur Rahaman @ Ahal (35) s/o Md. Salaouddin of Lilong Atoukhong Mamang Leikai.** Checked the black polythene bag which he brought in presence of the independent witnesses and found 2(two) yellow plastic caps containing white powder suspected to be Heroin no. 4 wrapped in a thin transparent plastic bag and **12(twelve) small packets light blue in colour containing 200 no. of small round tablets orange in colour suspected to be WY tablets in each packet.** On questioning, he revealed that the same white was heroin no. 4 and small orange tablets were WY tablets. On further questioning he disclosed that he bought the same illegal drugs Heroin no. 4 from one drugs peddlers namely **Md. Anish (26) s/o Md. Abdur Rashid of Chongtham** while WY tablets from one **Md. Gaffar of Lilong Turel Ahanbi Dam Maning** for sailing to his customer drugs users for his wrongful gain.

As the brown powder suspected to be heroin no.4 contained in the **3(three) caps which were found from the possession of Md. Mufizuddin** were of same colour and identical, all three were mixed and put in a thin transparent polythene bag. Same was weighed by a weighing machine brought by us and it weighed 42 gms. Out of the 42 grams of suspected Heroin no. 4, 5 (five) grams of the same were taken out and put inside two transparent plastic pouches with 2.5 grams each, packed and sealed and marked as "H1" & "H2" as Original and Duplicate Sample exhibit respectively. And the remaining 37 grams of the same powder was put inside the thin transparent polythene bag and again put into a yellow envelope, packed and sealed and marked as "H" as Parent Sample Exhibit. The 3(three) caps without heroin no. 4. Powder were packed all together and marked as "C1" as exhibit. Similarly, as the small round tablets suspected to be WY tablets contained in the **12(twelve) small packets light blue in colour** which were found from the possession of Md. Mufizuddin were of same colour and identical, all the tablets were mixed up and put in an another transparent thin plastic bag. On counting that were


2400 nos. of tablets altogether. On weighing, it weighed 240 grams. Out of the 2400 no. of tablets suspected to be WY tablets, 10 (ten) nos of tablets were taken out and put inside two transparent plastic pouches with 5 nos. of tablets each, packed and sealed and marked as "W1" & "W2" as Original and Duplicate Sample exhibit respectively. And the remaining 2390 nos. of tablets were put inside the thin transparent plastic bag and again put into a yellow envelope, packed and sealed and marked as "W" as Parent Sample Exhibit. The 12(twelve) blue small packets without the tablets were packed all together in a yellow envelope and marked as "WY1" as exhibit.

As the white powder suspected to be heroin no.4 contained in the 2(three) caps which were found from the possession of **Md. Wahidur Rahaman @ Ahal** were of same colour and identical, powder in the two caps were mixed and put inside another thin transparent polythene bag. It was weighed by a weighing machine brought by us and it weighed **26.6 grams**. Out of the 26.6 grams of suspected Heroin no. 4, 5 (five) grams of the same were taken out and put inside two transparent plastic pouches with 2.5 grams each, packed and sealed and marked as "D1" & "D2" as Original and Duplicate Sample exhibit respectively. And the remaining 21.6 grams of the same powder is put inside the inside another thin transparent polythene bag and again put into a yellow envelope, packed and sealed and marked as "D" as Parent Sample Exhibit. The 2(two) caps without heroin no 4. Powder were packed all together in a yellow envelope and marked as "C2" as exhibit. On the same way, as the small round tablets suspected to be WY tablets contained in the **26(twenty six) small packets light blue in colour which were found from the possession of Md. Wahidur Rahaman @ Ahal** were of same colour and identical, all the tablets were mixed up and put in an another transparent thin plastic bag. On counting that were **5200 nos. of tablets altogether**. On weighing, it weighed 520 grams. Out of the 5200 no. of tablets suspected to be WY tablets, 10 (ten) nos of tablets were taken out and put inside two transparent plastic pouches with 5 nos. of tablets each, packed and sealed and marked as "Y1" & "Y2" as Original and Duplicate Sample exhibit respectively. And the remaining 5190 nos. of tablets were put inside the thin transparent plastic bag and again put into a yellow envelope, packed and sealed and marked as "Y" as Parent Sample Exhibit. The 26(twenty six) blue small packets without the tablets were packed all together in a yellow envelope and marked as "WY2" as exhibit.

Therefore, arrested the two accused persons **Md. Mufizuddin** and **Md. Wahidur Rahaman @ Ahal** at 8:30 pm and 8:35 pm respectively. The said packed and sealed drugs were seized from the spot by preparing formal weighing and seizure memo in the presence of civil witnesses at 8:45 pm and 8:55 pm from two accused persons **Md. Mufizuddin** and **Md. Wahidur Rahaman @ Ahal** respectively. Then I immediately informed my senior officers about the incident. Hence a Suo Motto case under **FIR No. 44(04)2019, LIL PS U/S 21(c)/29 ND & PS Act** is registered for investigation.
